CATTLE DEPARTMENT

Entries close September 26 at 4:00 p.m. Stalls will be assigned by the Directors in Charge Enclose \$25.00 for each Exhibitor's Ticket required. Exhibitors will furnish their own feed and bedding.

Dairy Bulls must be handled by both staff and rope or chain attached to a heavy leathe neck band or halter. Dairy Bulls over six months of age must be tied with a double tie; consisting of a suitable neck strap or halter and another tie preferably a chain around the horns and running through the nose ring.

Every female over twenty-four months old must have produced a living calf within twelve months or prove to be with calf. Every bull thirty-six months old must have had dropped to his service a calf within twelve months previous to the opening dates of this Fair, to be eligible to compete. A freemartin heifer shall be barred from showing until she has become of such age as to have proven a breeder. No animal which is not entered and shown in single classes shall be permitted to show in groups. **Arrival and Release Time: See Page 12, Rule No. 30.**

All exhibitors will be limited to not more than two entries in any one class.

All animals, regardless of age, must be recorded and appear in the name of the exhibitor on the records of their respective associations.

All exhibitors must be prepared to show certificates, registration or qualified when called for. Failure forfeits right to show or award.

No premium will be awarded unless animal corresponds to description and ownership as shown by registration and transfer certificates.

Open Beef Breeding classes will follow the same breed qualification as Jr. Fair. Breed classes must have a minimum of 2 entries per Breed or will show in AOB division.

Enclose \$25.00 for each exhibitor ticket required & \$5.00 per head entered. Truck-in cattle preferred day of show. Indicate on entry blank if "Stall needed or Truck-in".
